Colin Olesen was born in Otahuhu. After attending
Papakura High School, he studied at Auckland Technical
Institute and gained entry to the New Zealand Institute of
Chartered Accountants and subsequently membership of
the Chartered Institute of Secretaries. During his studies
he worked in industry and moved to the public practice
setting in 1973. Colin commenced practice in Pahiatua in
1975 and moved to Te Puke in 1991. In 1985 Colin was
appointed a Justice of the Peace for New Zealand.

Colin joined the Rotary Club of Te Puke in 1992, elected
President in 1995-1996 and again 2001-2003, and in 2005
appointed Assistant Governor for Area 7.

Colin belonged to the Jaycees organisation. He was a
chapter President and then Deputy Regional Governor.
Colin has also served on his local school committee as
Chair. He was involved in the establishment of a
Residential Home for the elderly in Pahiatua and was
Chair. He is a Trustee of Vincent House Trust, a
residential rehabilitation centre for mental health, and drug
and alcohol affected people. Colin is a dedicated
Christian.
